# How to apply

- Freshmen applying to Columbus can use the **Coalition Application** or the **Common Application**.
- Both went live on August 1.

*There is no advantage to one application over the other.*

## What's new on the application?

- Change to Engineering – **Strongly encouraged** that students apply by November 1
- Ohio residency questions
- Family housing language change
- Disciplinary question, process updates
  
- Finish Strong



# Application deadlines and dates

- **November 1 early action** deadline, admission decision by the end of January
- **Strongly encouraged to apply and complete the application by November 1:** considered for most university merit scholarships and for majors within the College of Engineering
- **We highly recommend applying by November 1** to be considered for the Morrill Scholarship Program and Honors and Scholars Programs.
- February 1, 2020, is the final submission deadline



# ACT/SAT updates

The **September 14 ACT** is the last test that will meet our November 1 priority application date.

The **August 24 SAT** is the last test that will meet our November 1 priority application date.

# Who we're looking for

Students who show evidence that they are ...

- Not only smart but **willing to lead**.
- Who **see strength in diversity** of people and ideas.
- Who **seek collaboration when solving problems**.
- Who make use of all opportunities to **figure out what kind of impact they want to have on the world**.



# How we evaluate applications

So how do we take those lofty ideals and turn them into criteria by which we judge an admission application?

- We evaluate each applicant in terms of **9 criteria**.
- We review each application **thoroughly**.
- We evaluate each applicant **holistically**.



# Admission factors

- College prep curriculum
- High school performance (class rank or GPA)
- ACT or SAT scores
- Accelerated curriculum (Honors, AP, IB, CCP)
- Ability and desire to contribute to and engage with a diverse campus community (cultural, economic, racial, geographic)
- Leadership, co-curricular and work experiences

Natural science (with significant lab experience)	3 units		X
Social science	2 units	3 units	
Foreign language	2 units of same language	3 units	X
Visual or performing arts	1 unit		
Plus 1 additional unit in any of the above subjects			



# A snapshot of last year's admitted class

Most exceeded minimum college prep requirements

- **89 percent** exceeded foreign language requirement
- **99 percent** exceeded math requirements
- **91 percent** exceeded natural science requirements



# A snapshot of last year's admitted class

Most ranked in the top of their high school classes

- **96 percent** ranked in top 25%
- **66 percent** ranked in top 10%



# A snapshot of last year's admitted class

Most performed very well on standardized tests

## *ACT composite*

- 50% of admitted students scored between 28 and 32
- 25% scored below 28
- 25% scored above 32

## *SAT (Evidence-Based Reading and Writing + Math)*

- 50% of admitted students scored between 1300 and 1430
- 25% scored below 1300
- 25% scored above 1430



# Decisions

- **Admit** to the Columbus campus
- **Deny** to the Columbus campus

*\*\*Ohio residents not admitted to the Columbus campus are automatically **Optioned** to an Ohio State regional campus*

- **Defer** to be considered again during the mid-March review once all applications are received
